8th grade history class to learn about law and bet-



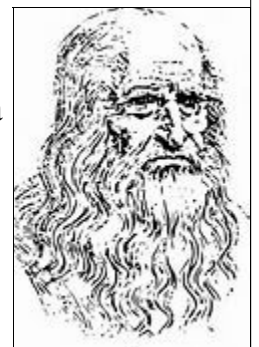
ter understand what happens after a child breaks the law and goes to court. They found out what crimes were committed most by people under 18, and learned how to get the best results for themselves out of a court case.
